

WHAT'S LEGAL? Medical vs. Adult-use Cannabis

AMOUNT YOU CAN GROW	Up to 6 cannabis plants, inside or on the grounds of your private residence (subject to local restrictions). C, 6	Up to 6 mature cannabis plants or 12 immature plants (subject to local restrictions). ⁵

NOTES

A Individuals of any age may legally possess and use medicinal cannabis with a valid physician's recommendation. However, only adults ages 18 and older can legally purchase medicinal cannabis.

B If a qualified patient or primary caregiver has a physician's recommendation that this quantity does not meet the qualified patient's medical needs, the qualified patient or primary caregiver may possess an amount of cannabis consistent with the patient's needs.

C Cultivation area must be locked and not visible from any public place. Cities and counties may limit or prohibit outdoor cannabis cultivation and may impose other "reasonable regulations." Note that it is illegal to sell any amount of cannabis without a license.
