CONTRACTORS STATE LICENSE BOARD (CSLB)

- Licensing and regulatory body over construction industry
- Investigates complaints against licensed and unlicensed contractors for violations of California's Contractors License Laws (up to 4 years from the date of the act)
 - · Includes active projects, illegal advertisements by unlicensed contractors, failing to pull permits
- CSLB licensure is required for contractors performing projects totaling \$500 or more (labor and materials)
- Did you know?
 - Contractor Salespersons are also required to be registered with CSLB

CONTRACTOR REQUIREMENTS

TO QUALIFY FOR A LICENSE


- Contractor must verify four years of journey-level experience
- Pass two tests to obtain licensure:
 - Law and business
 - Trade
- Pass a criminal background check
- Obtain and post a license bond for \$12,500 – viewable on CSLB website
- Note: Unlicensed contractors can only perform work valued \$500 or less

WHAT TO KNOW WHEN HIRING A CONTRACTOR (WRITTEN CONTRACTS)

- Required for home improvement projects over \$500
- Contracts must include
 - Contractor's name, business address, and their contractor license number
 - A detailed scope of work with the products and materials to be used. How work will be performed.
 - Payment schedule.
 - Who gets the building permits
 - Date of completion
 - Debris cleanup or removal
 - 3 day right to cancel.
- Any Changes must be done in writing with a 'Change Order'
- Keep in mind certain projects may demand additional plans and scale drawings

WHAT TO KNOW WHEN HIRING A CONTRACTOR (CONTINUED)

Down Payments

• Cannot exceed \$1,000 or 10% of the total contract price- whichever is less; Regardless of the project size.

Solar Projects ONLY

- As of Jan 1, 2019: Contractors must provide Solar Energy System Disclosure Document
- Contract and document must be written in the same language used in the verbal presentation

IMPORTANT: Don't rush!

Read the contract before you sign and make sure you understand all the terms.

MECHANIC'S LIENS

WHAT IS A MECHANIC'S LIEN

- A legal claim on property for unpaid work or supplies
- Can be filed by an unpaid contractor, subcontractor, laborer, or materials supplier
- Must be recorded at the County recorder's
 office within 90 days of completing the
 work; or 60 days after the owner records
 a notice of completion or cessation.

WHAT IF A MECHANICS LIEN IS FILED?

- Determine if it is a valid lien
- Record Keeping
- Preliminary Notice
- CONTACT AN ATTORNEY

COMMON CONTRACTOR SCAMS

- Door-to-door sales
 - "Happen to be in the neighborhood..." or "happens to have leftover materials"
- Requires the money up front or requires a large down payment
- Uses high-pressure sales tactics
 - Offer only good for today
- Agrees to the job and while doing work, finds other issues to repair
- Swaps expensive materials for cheaper materials
- Incomplete portions of the contract (fill in later)
- Contact DCBA (800) 593-8222

HELPFUL TIPS

- Check the License
- Only hire licensed contractors
- Get three bids
- Permits
- Written contract

- Three days to cancel
- Down payment
- Schedule payments
- Never pay cash
- Final payment


